



The Bynums' lives were turned upside down again in 2003 when Clarke was diagnosed with cancer. Now it was Sissy's turn to be heroic. She cared for Clarke during his illness, but sadly, on Labor Day in 2007, Clarke passed away. Though she always loved business, caring for Clarke inspired her to do something more meaningful at this stage of her life. So, at age 54, she was accepted into the Certified Nurse Assistant program at Midlands Technical College, where she later earned her CNA certification and eventually a phlebotomy certification. Sissy now works on an "as needed" basis at Lexington Medical Center in the cardiovascular and surgical intensive care units. She realizes that being a first-generation college graduate was a major factor of the success she has enjoyed. Sissy also appreciates and acknowledges how fortunate she and many other family members are to be a part of the Clemson family. Clarke left his mark on so many people, and




