Today I would like for the Clemson Family to celebrate the milestones in its rich history, honor alumni and donors who continue to illustrate the importance of giving back, and to express our sincere gratitude to those who have come before us to lay the foundation for this amazing place, and to encourage you to make plans to be a part of Clemson's future.

The Legacy Day Celebration to honor the signing of Thomas Green Clemson's Will, which led to the founding of this great University was started in 2009. Each year we celebrate the fact that our University began through an act of philanthropy by Anna Calhoun Clemson and Thomas Green Clemson. Many students joined us at Ft. Hill to celebrate our legacy and several donors came by to sign the Clemson Legacy Registry as a symbol of their commitment to include Clemson in their estate plan.

We owe a special debt of gratitude to the members of the Fort Hill Legacy Society, who are memorialized by bronze leaves scattered under the majestic limbs of the Second Century Oak at Ft. Hill. Each of the personalized bronze leaves represent an individual or couple who created a bequest or a trust resulting in a gift of \$1 million or more for the benefit of Clemson University. The beautiful leaves demonstrate enlightened acts of philanthropy that will benefit Clemson forever.
